Dear Chairwoman Black and Representative Thompson:

On behalf of the Alliance for Connected Care, a group representing Medicare health plans, providers and vendors who serve millions of consumers, we write to support the Increasing Telehealth Access in Medicare Act, H.R. 3727.

This bipartisan legislation will enable wider use of connected care technologies among seniors in Medicare Advantage, a significant step forward in opening Medicare to these technologies. Telehealth has been shown to be effective at lowering costs and improving access to care in the commercial market, Medicaid and within the Veterans Administration. We view it as an important tool in increasing consumer access to high quality, affordable healthcare, improving patient satisfaction and reducing costs. Given recent advances in technology, telemedicine gives customers a new way to be more engaged in their care, and save time and money. Additionally, telemedicine contributes to the value-based care goals of patient engagement, expanded hours for primary care, population health management and care coordination.
